CMHF Participant Diagnoses Introduction



- •To better understand uses of funding we collect diagnostic information of participants in funding proposals. This is anonymous, aggregated, and cannot identify individuals.
- •Information includes persons who receive CMHF-funded services and persons served through other funding sources (Medicaid, private insurance, grants, etc.).
- •Not all agencies diagnose or maintain this type of information. Information was provided by about two-thirds of funded agencies.
- •Because people can have more than one health condition, this analysis counts the number of diagnoses, rather than the number of people.
- •Information is based on the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, revised 5th edition (DSM-5-TR®).

The most common conditions are trauma, anxiety and depression.

CMHF was much more likely to be a funder when trauma is identified.

CMHF support was indicated in relatively fewer situations when bipolar disorder was identified, and more often when schizophrenia was identified.

Other funding sources were indicated more often when children's disruptive disorders, co-occurring substance and addiction, and neurodevelopmental disorders, were identified.
